BridgeValley Celebrates 5 Years of Advanced Technology Center's Success *The workforce training center houses both college programs and community events*

South Charleston, WV - BridgeValley Community and Technical College celebrated five years of successful partnership and innovation in its Advanced Technology Center (ATC) on December 3 with a holiday event that boasted more than 60 attendees.

The ATC is BridgeValley's workforce training center, housing laboratories and training rooms for programs like gas measurement, advanced manufacturing technology, utility linemen, home inspection, CDL and HVAC.

Over the last five years, the ATC has hosted nearly 1,000 training sessions, meetings, and events including career fairs, robotics teams, maker camps, and professional surveying seminars. Additionally it has housed career-exploration opportunities like STEAM Camp, Raspberry Pi Camp, Introduce a Girl to Engineering Day, Manufacturing Day, STEMersion, and Vex Robotics Competition.

The anniversary event featured a keynote address from J. Craig McAtee, Executive Director and CEO of National Coalition of Advanced Technology Centers (NCATC), as well as an address from Chris T. Beam, President and CEO of Appalachian Power. BridgeValley President Dr. Eunice Bellinger and Senior Vice President Jeff Wyco shared the storied success of the center as well as plans for the future - including upcoming program offerings for 2020.

"We are so proud of the impact that the Advanced Technology Center has made not only at BridgeValley, but also in our community," said Heather Williamson, BridgeValley Workforce Operations Coordinator.
