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## BridgeValley Community and Technical College Hosts 21st Annual Capital City Pumpkin Drop on October 17

**Montgomery, WV** - Students from 44 schools representing nearly 15 counties will participate in the 20th Annual Capital City Pumpkin Drop on Thursday, October 18 from 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at Appalachian Power Park in Charleston.

The fun-filled day of competition and activities hosted by BridgeValley Community and Technical College will pit elementary, middle and high school students across West Virginia against each other to see whose pumpkin will survive. Students will follow a set of design criteria to create a secure case to house their pumpkin using math and science. Their container will then be dropped from a designated height and judged by a team of BridgeValley staff and students who will assess the state of the pumpkin, as well as how close it landed to the target. Trophies and cash prizes will be awarded to the top schools in the high school, middle school, and elementary school categories. Additionally, "Most Creative Design" and "Most Sustainable Design" also will be awarded.

This event is designed to help West Virginia's youth become interested in STEM-related activities and fields. While students work on team building and delve into math and physics concepts, they're thinking, designing and creating through this friendly competition.
