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## **BridgeValley Instructor Headed to Brazil**

Professor Machele Kindle to present at 6th SEMTEC Symposium

(Montgomery, WV) - In a collaboration with Faculdade de Technologia do Estado de São Palo (FATEC), BridgeValley Community and Technical College Professor Machele Kindle and Brazilian colleague Osvaldo Succi will present at the 6th SEMTEC Symposium at Centro Paula Souza University in Brazil August 8-9. The presentation, "Collaborative Virtual Internationalization: A qualitative perspective from a project between Faculdade de Technologia do Estado de São Paulo and BridgeValley Community and Technical College," discusses the new, Collaborative Online Intercultural Learning (COIL) virtual exchange program between the two colleges, which provides an international experience to students of both schools.

"The paper is an overview of the program we're putting together," said Kindle. "It provides background about COIL, what Osvaldo is doing in Brazil and our joint effort. We're introducing BridgeValley on an international scale to our colleagues. By being there, I can meet them and plan face-to-face what we're going to be doing this semester for our students."

As the only community college in West Virginia offering the COIL experience, BridgeValley students participating in COIL will receive a distance education component in existing courses in collaboration with a class offered at another institution. For example, Kindle will teach a physical science course and partner with an IT class at FATEC to extract and interpret temperature data relating to climate change.

Throughout the semester, the IT class will extract data from a database, while the science class will learn how to graph the data to determine what it means when temperatures continue to rise. The program goes beyond the standard learning experience and provides interaction between classes and cultures.

"[COIL] is great exposure for our students," said Kindle. "Some of our students don't have an opportunity to travel. This is a way through that barrier to get exposure and allow them to interact with a new culture to get experience and add to their resume."
