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## BridgeValley Community and Technical College Holding Maker Camp for Students Aged 12-16 this Summer

BridgeValley Community and Technical College will hold the second annual Maker Camp for students aged 12 to 16 from July 15-19.

Classes throughout the week are designed to build upon each other to help students form a skillset using software similar to what is used within BridgeValley's programs. Students attending the Maker Camp will create products including a Raspberry Pi microcomputer and 3D printed items to take home once camp is complete.

"The Maker Camp skews slightly older than most of our other programs, and allows students a chance to make something cool that they get to keep," said BridgeValley Assistant Professor Jason Spencer. "The skills they learn at this camp, in the areas of 3D design and programming, may translate to something they are interested in as a career, and can correlate to a college program. With the WV Invests program recently being announced, some of these kids may be future community college students and BridgeValley would be proud to get them interested in these programs early."

Partially sponsored by the Nuts, Bolts and Thingamajigs (NBT) Foundation, BridgeValley's Maker Camp is tailored to provide students with skills taught within the college's 3D design and printing and programming curriculum.
